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Overview

As for the ancestry of Agnes ... wife of Alman/Frederick Cortright, we received a clue from Jack Sterling ... a Mauch Chunk Historian ... who also maintains a wonderful page detailing Mauch Chunk's history and providing wonderful resources to Family Researchers – [Carbon County History & Genealogy](#).

"The parents of Agnes were Charles & Elsie (Deremer) Kannapel. The Deremers were early settlers in Mauch Chunk, Elsie being the daughter of Peter and Mary (Quick) Deremer. Peter died sometime in the 1850s after which Mary married a fellow named Davenport. Peter and Mary came to Mauch Chunk from NJ in the 1840s."

and a subsequent e-mail states ...

"Agnes was the daughter of Charles & Elsie M. (DeRemer) Kannapel. Charles was born about 1832 in France (probably Alsace) and Elsie abt. 10/1835 in NJ. Charles immigrated about 1850 and about 1857 he married Elsie. Elsie's parents were Peter & Mary (Quick) DeRemer, both natives of NJ. Peter was born about 1809 and died in the 1850s in Mauch Chunk. Mary was born on or about 12/26/1811 and after the death of her husband she married a 2nd time, this fellow's name being Davenport. All I know about him is his surname, since he does not appear in any MC Census. I didn't even know what had become of Mary until, purely by chance, I came across the obit of a Mary Davenport from the 6/5/1896 Coal Gazette. She had remained in Chunk following her re-marriage, but before seeing the obit, I didn't know she HAD remarried, let alone where she was living."

With the information above we were off and running on tracing Charles. It has been a fun odyssey!

We also had some interest in the origin of the name as we eventually confirmed that Charles (and a brother Louis) emigrated from Alsace France. This is consistent with the origin of the name!

Charles Kannapel & Family

As is typical for the time period ... there is not much written about most people. And, unfortunately we have yet to identify when Charles and wife Elsie died ... this would help us see if obituaries were published that would hopefully reveal some tidbits about the family. We have tracked the family through the census and have some bits and pieces here and there to tell us a bit more about them.

Census

We show later that Charles (& brother Louis) emigrated in 1851 and so just missed the 1850 Census. We also show later that Charles started the process to become a citizen in 1855 in Mauch Chunk. We may never know for sure where Charles was between 1851 and 1855.

Obviously, by 1870, Charles is no longer working as a confectioner and subsequently worked as a laborer. We also know that when Mary Quick Deremer Davenport (mother of Agnes) dies in 1895, her obituary states that she, at one time, had lived in the old "Kannapel House!" We have yet to identify the address of this residence.

"Dad said that the older brother [Louis] was being conscripted into the Army -- German I believe. Since they were ex Germans living in Alsace which was being fought over in the Franco-Prussian War the family did not want him to go. When the Army came to get him his family hid him in their outside bake oven (a considerable structure I was led to believe.) The father then had him go to America. He did not want him to go alone so he sent the two boys together. Don't know if that's true or not but that's the story I remember. Some one, maybe my Grandmother when I stayed with her and used to play in the old store down stairs, said that Charles was indentured to someone back in Europe who made candy and he was an apprentice. I think she also said (or maybe it was my Dad) that he brought with him some of the candy molds that were used in the old country. I remember that quite clearly 'cause one time playing in our basement in ... and I found a bunch old cookie cutters made out of tin. My mother's father (Sylvester Fritch) was a tin smith by trade then and he had made them. She used them to make Christmas cookies and they were all tied on one string and hanging from one of the rafters in our basement. Anyway, she said that my Dad's father had had Sylvester make some newer molds for him that were much smaller for making candy and probably pasteries."

So, we know that Agnes is now married to Alman/Frederick Cortright and so is with her family. Otherwise, Louis/Lewis is the only other child missing. It looks like Lewis P. Kanaple, married young and is living with his family in Lehman, Luzerne and working on a farm^v.

Obviously, by now, everyone is out of the house and if the census is to be believed, one of the children alive in 1880 is deceased and there are two other children born that we don't have a record of – given the information that 9 children were born of which 5 survive. The only child not accounted for in 1900 is daughter Hattie ... since she was 9 in 1880, she probably subsequently married and then died, or died before marrying.

Sons, Charles H^{viii} and George^{ix} are living in East Mauch Chunk with their families.

INJURED AT PACKERTON.

James Kanapel, a son of Special Officer Charles Kanapel, of East Mauch Chunk, who is employed as a car checker in the Packerton yard, was injured Monday morning at Packerton while hurriedly trying to cross a moving coal train. He had to be conveyed to his home because of a badly sprained ankle caused by being hurled to the ground.

It looks like sons George and Louis are deceased though we find their children listed!

Birth, Marriage, Death

We have no information on births or marriages. We have not yet which church in Mauch Chunk the family was associated with.



It looks like Charles and Elsie might be buried with a son's family In Evergreen Cemetery^{xiii}, Jim Thorpe, Pennsylvania... and are listed as "Mother" and "Father" and so not much information is available – or this could be a namesake! There is clearly a link to Charles and Elsie (Deremer) Kannapel listed!

If one looks at the below entry ... the connection that John A Leyer had to the family was via marrying a daughter, Ruth Kannapel (daughter of Isaac) ...

Citizenship

It appears that Charles emigrated to the US and pretty quickly filed for and became an American Citizen.

For some reason there are two sets of paperwork though they appear to have the same basic data! Also, the paperwork is so basic and uninformative compared to what it became in subsequent years! So, basically it tells you who he was, that he renounces the country he came from, that he was from Alsace and traveled from Le Havre in 1851 ... that's pretty much it. Though, with this information, we were able to find his passenger record.

He appears to have registered to become a citizen in 1855 and then the petition was filed in 1858^{xiv}. His name was listed as Charles Kanabel for the 8th June 1855 Registry and then as Charles Kanapel for the 4th October 1858 Petition.

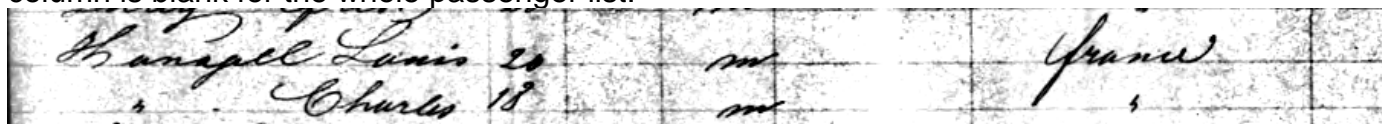

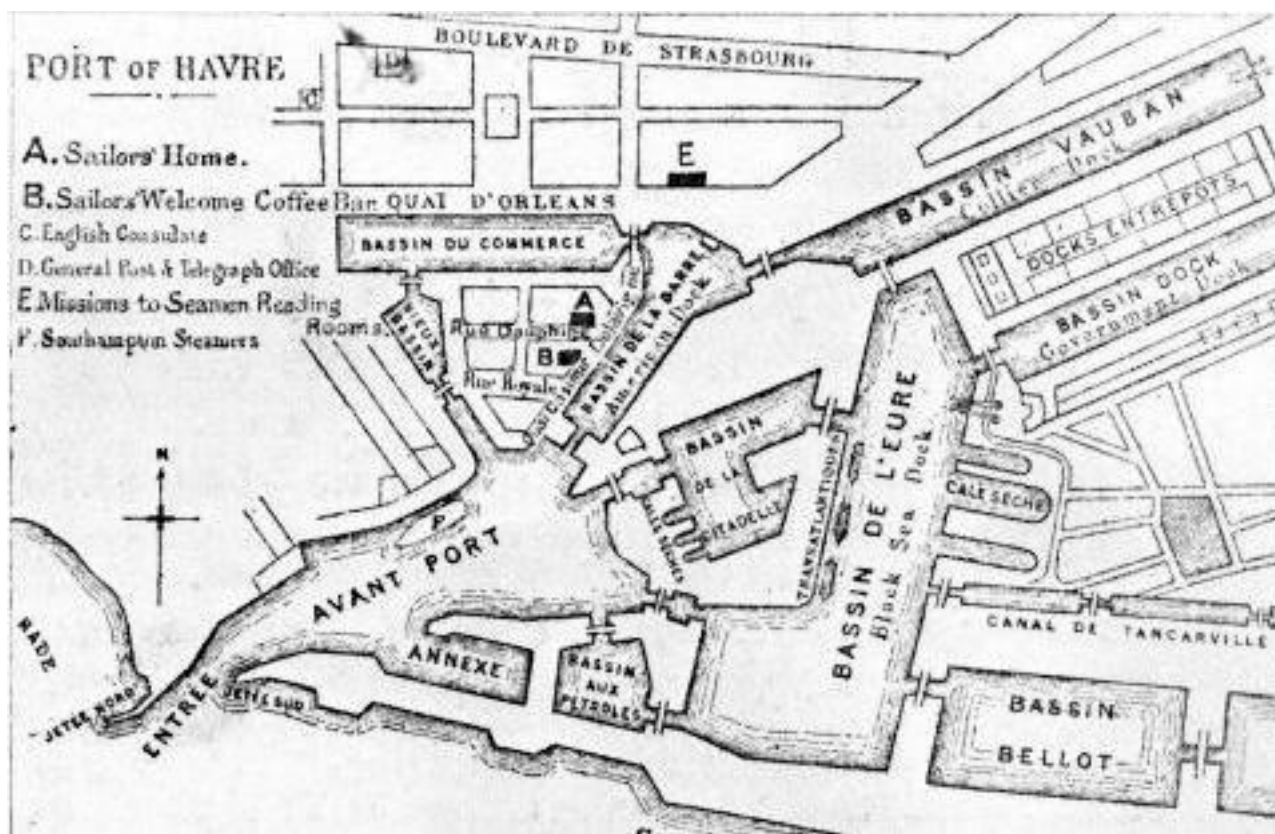
It's easy to imagine Kannapel becoming Kanappel becoming Kanassel ... his citizenship papers state that he arrived March 19, 1851... we won't quibble with March 20, 1851 ... the papers also say that he came via Havre ... that matches ... Also, we know that Charles was born c. 1833, also consistent!

Interestingly, it looks like a brother Louis, also emigrated ... if so, where did he end up ... see Appendix A for what we have learned about Louis and his life in the US!

If one looks at the original entry^{xv} ... voila ... it says Kanapel! Yippee.... Still the mystery of Louis! Also, the actual passenger record does NOT list the occupation as farmer ... that column is blank for the whole passenger list.



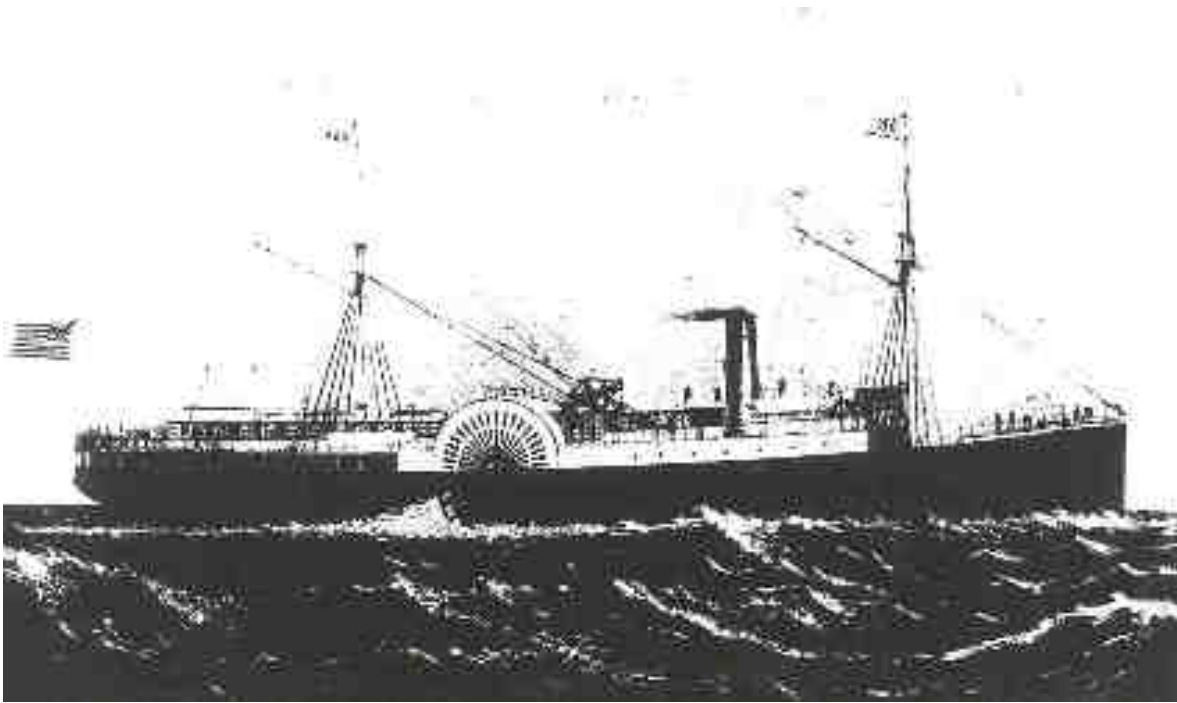

Info on a sister ship^{xvi} ... There does not appear to be any information on the Samuel M. Fox specifically ...

The Isaac Bell (1,072 tons), the last packet built on order for the Havre Old and Whitlock (or Union) Line was launched by Webb in 1851 and entered the service that year. The Isaac Bell was 121 feet long, 37 feet wide and 26 feet deep. She was a sister ship of the Samuel M. Fox (1,062 tons), built late in 1850, and was the second largest packet built by Webb for the Havre service, being exceeded in size only by the Gallia of 1,190 tons, constructed in 1849. Clark says that the Isaac Bell, under the command of Capt. John Johnston, "made three voyages from Havre to New York in less than eighteen days each, one being in the month of January, which is about the hardest month in the twelve for a ship bound to the -westward." No vessel in the history of sail ever made three westbound passages of the Atlantic "in less than eighteen days," port to port, and the length of packet crossings was measured from port or city of departure to a similar arrival and not from land to land, light to light, or point to point. The Isaac Bell is officially credited with one 19-day westward passage the fastest since the twenties, when the little Bayard (339 tons) made a crossing in 18 days; the next fastest 'westward run of the "Bell" occupied at least 20 days, as from 1830 to the "Bell's" departure from, the New York-Havre packet service, only six authenticated westward passages were made in better than 21 days, port to port, and the Gallia, Havre II, Sylvie de Grasse, and Henri IV are each credited with 20-day runs, port to port. The Isaac Bell operated in the Havre line for only three years (1851-1854), following which she was a general trader and transient except in 1857-1858, when she temporarily joined the New York-London Black X packet fleet. During her career as a Havre liner, the "Bell" averaged 33 days on her westbound passages, and her longest crossing occupied forty-five days. Date of surrender-8-23-1860, and reason for surrender was "vessel wrecked".

By researching the internet and posting queries, such as this one in French, at Geneanet and also on an Alsace Genealogy bulletin board, ... we ended being in touch with about half-a-dozen Kannapel relatives and other interested genealogy researchers. We can honestly say that that surpasses any other line!

My husband has an ancestor, Charles Kannapel, born about 1833 in Alsace. He could have a brother, Louis Kannapel, born about 1831. They emigrated through Le Havre in 1851. Charles lived in Pennsylvania and became a citizen in 1855. It says that he was from Alsace. In your research, have you come across Kannapel, Kanappel, Canaple, and other variants with a born Charles c. 1833? If yes, please let me know.. I can tell you what happened to Charles in the United States.

As with any new area ... some understanding of the geography and record keeping and reference standards and the like come in very useful. We quickly learned that Alsace was divided between Haut Rhin (68) and Bas Rhin (67). These identifiers along with the associated numbers are very important when researching in French records and on French message boards. Some of this is because, like in the US, it is not uncommon to have a town or community name used many times throughout the country! The map at the end of the section gives an overview of Alsace and shows how it borders Lorraine in France and Germany on its eastern border!

The first break came when someone shared the following^{xvii}:

In the 1836 census, this CANNAPEL family, living in Soultz-sous-Forêts, has children with the correct names and ages:

CANNAPEL: Joseph 38, Sibille 28 (nee LAUTERBACH), Louis 6, Charles 4, Célestine 2.

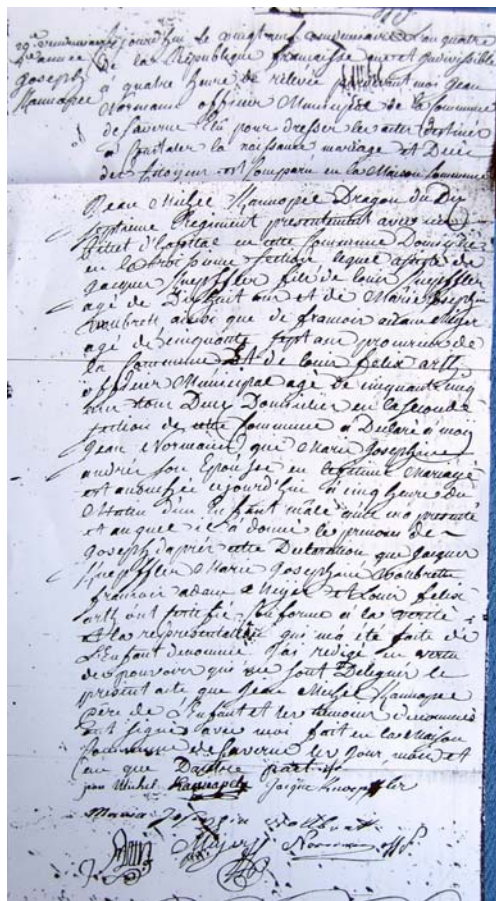
“1836: by order of king Louis-Philippe 1st, town's mayors carry out the first official registration list on their town, by applying ministerial orders. Therefore, residents are grouped into families, names, first names, age, religion, profession, civil status, addresses are noted for each resident.”^{xviii}

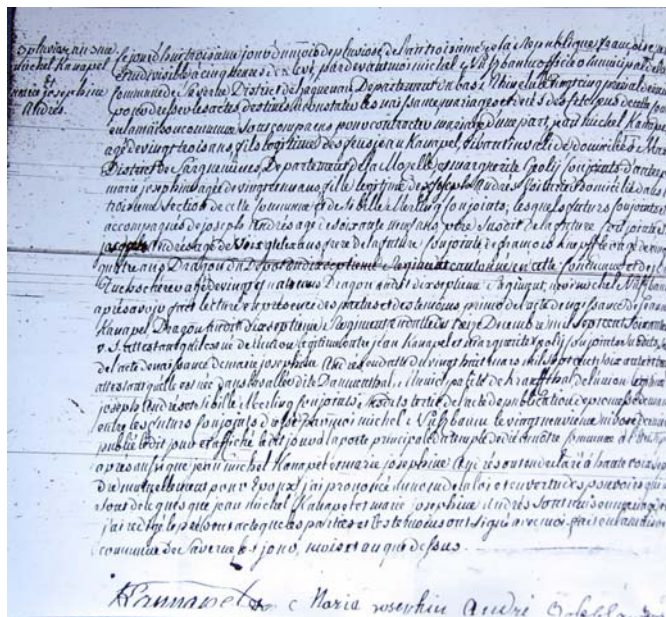

Appendix A Louis Kannapel

Until we found the passenger record for Charles ... we did not know that a brother, Louis, had also emigrated. This was mostly because we did not find Louis living in Mauch Chunk or environs and had never come across any references to him.

Once we discovered Louis ... he was an interesting person to research once we discovered that he lived in New York City and had served in the Civil War, in the Union army. We have tracked Louis through many of the censuses (though not the earlier ones and we suspect that spelling variants is the culprit!) and also have obtained records pertaining to his Civil War Service.

Not surprisingly, we don't think his name was every spelled the same way twice! Going chronologically, starting with after he has emigrated with brother Charles ...

The clincher that this was our Louis was that he was a Carver ... otherwise the age is off a little bit though his name was pretty unique, even for New York City & area! The reference to Baden makes us wonder if he spoke German ... remember that Alsace is on the France-Germany border and as seen previously, the Kannapel family originated from Maxstedt in Germany.

In 1861, Louis joined the Union Army and fought in the Civil War^{xxiii}

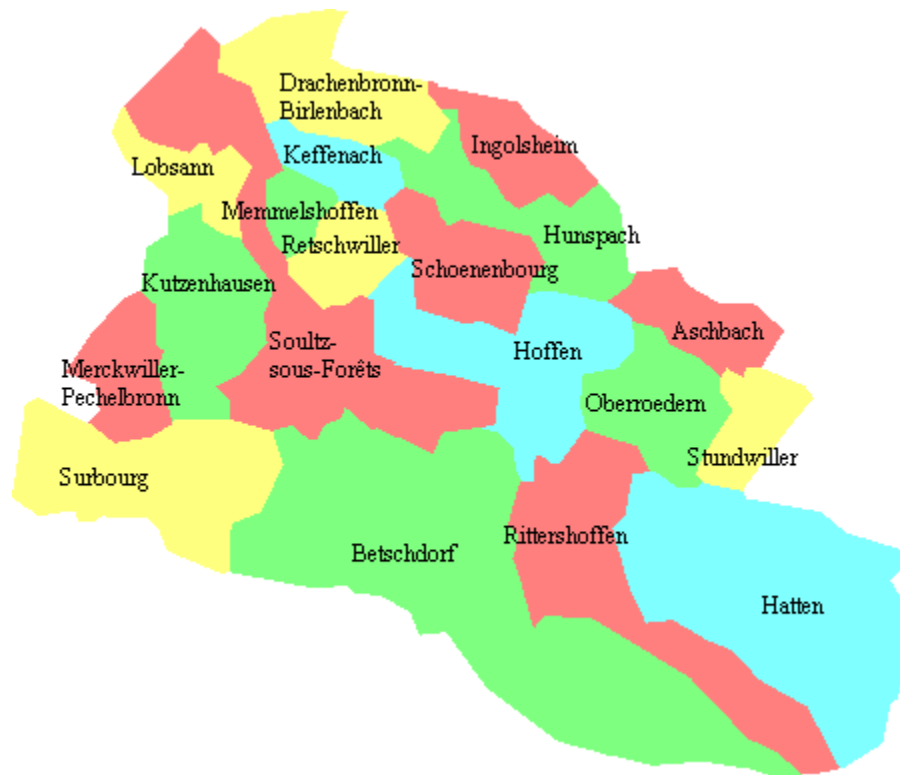
