WOLFENDEN



On October 20, 1874 at the Particular Baptist Chapel Victoria St., Monks Coppenhall, in the district of Nantwich, in the County of Chester -- Samuel Taylor and Alice Wolfenden were married as witnessed by his brother James Taylor Jun. and her sister Eliza.¹

Pictured to the left is Alice with her granddaughters – Alice Oddy, Mabel Oddy, Beatrice Oddy and Elsie Taylor shortly after Elsie's birth in 1907. Edith Warburton in correspondence dated Nov

2000, offers the following ... "Grandma Taylor was a love, small rosy cheeked and white haired, she managed a grocery shop – one of several that belonged to "Jimmy" Middleton, I believe he was her brother (we know it was brother-in-law)."

MARRIED in the Particular Baptist Chapel according to the Rites and Ceremonies of the Particular Baptists by *testificate* by me, *S. A. Guinness, Minister* *J. Peckover, Registrar*

This Marriage was solemnized between us, *Samuel Taylor* in the Presence of us, *James Taylor Jun* *Alice Wolfenden*

Besides Eliza, Alice (herself born 22 August 1854²) had at least five other sisters and one brother, all born in Oldham and baptized at Prestwich³

William (born 24 April 1853, died August 7, 1875)

Emma (born 15 Dec 1855)

Louise (born 1 April 1857)

Mary (born 2 Oct 1858)

Ann (born 10 May 1860)

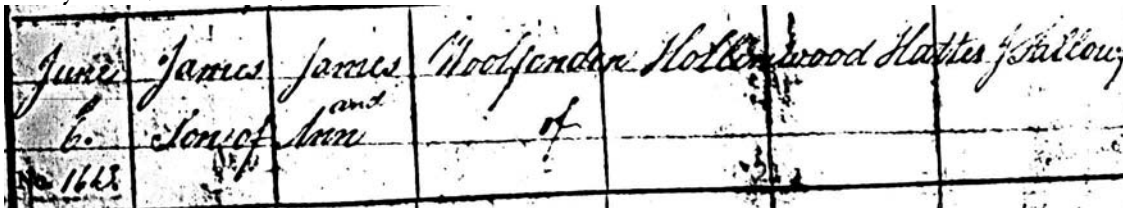

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Their parents were James Wo(o)lfenden and Sarah Ann Cros(s)ley who were married 24 October 1850 in the Parish of Prestwich.⁴ (Since so little has been discovered about Sarah Ann's ancestry, please see Appendix C for what's known.) (NOT INCLUDED)

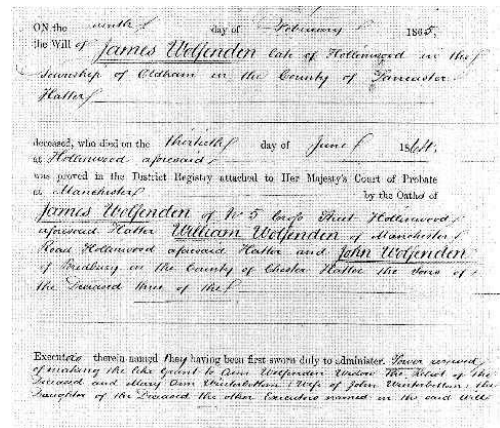
Note the letters in parenthesis in the above paragraph – adding these letters gives you the most popular alternate spellings of these names: Wolfenden or Woolfenden and Crosley or Crossley. Since many individuals could not sign their name, the clerk registering the event relied on “what it sounded like to them” and “how they thought it might be spelled!”

James worked as a Hatter according to the censuses from 1841 to 1881 as well as various birth, marriage and will sources. Interestingly, Alice married into a Hat Manufacturing family. Maybe this was how Alice and Samuel met. And, the 1871 Worrall Directory of Oldham lists Taylor & Wolfenden, Hat Manufacturer, New Road, Failsworth -- is there a connection?



James was the son of a Hat Manufacturer⁵. His parents were James and Ann Wolfenden and he was one of at least five children, all baptized at St. Marys, Oldham.⁶

- William (2 March 1817)
- James (6 June 1819)
- John (17 June 1821)
- Henry (3 July 1825 - 8 Dec 1826⁷)
- Mary Ann (28 Feb 1836)



James Sr. died 30 June 1864 of Natural Decay and Ann died 19 February 1879 of Bronchitis.⁸ When James Sr.

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died, he had a will which was proved 9 February 1865, probate granted to his sons James, William and John. His estate was under 1000 pounds⁹. On the previous page is a portion of the proved will – listing out the sons James (living at 5 Cross St, Hollinwood), William (Manchester Rd, Hollinwood) and John (Bredbury, Cheshire) and below mentioning the widow, Ann, and daughter, Mary Ann Winterbottom. The witnesses to the will were James Mills (Oldham) and Charles Taylor (Hollinwood).

And, when his wife Ann died, there was a Letter of Administration...

“Letter of Administration: Administration of Personal Estate of Ann Wolfenden, late of 375 Hollins Road, Hollinwood near Manchester in the County of Lancaster widow who died 19 February 1879 at 375 Hollins Road was granted at Manchester to James Wolfenden of 375 Hollins Road, hatter the son and one of the next of kin. Personal Estate under 800 pounds. Letter of Administration dated 19 April 1879.”

In the 1851 census, James Sr. lists a birthplace of Rochdale. Unfortunately, many James Wolfenden's were born and/or married in Rochdale during this period. For more information on James Jr.'s siblings, see Appendix A. (NOT INCLUDED)

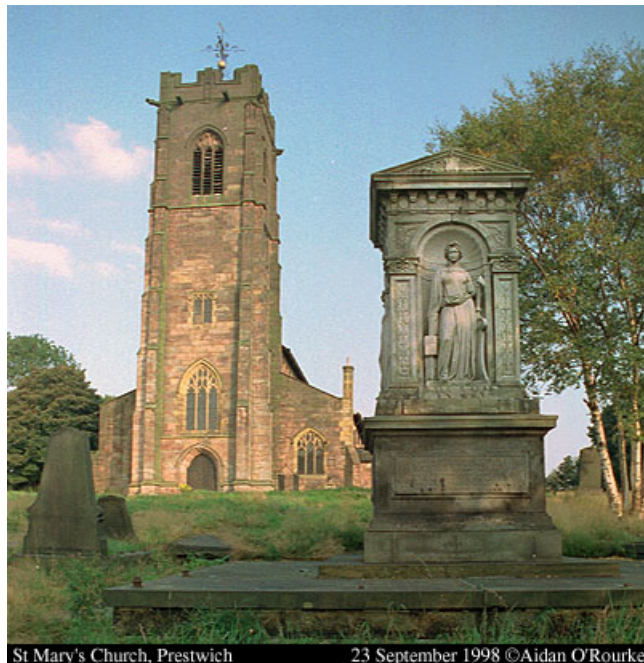

This last entry is interesting as it shows Sarah Ann living with her daughter and son-in-law. This matches other information found that indicated that the Voters' Lists for Hollins Road, Hollinwood showed James Wolfenden listed until 1890, Joseph Birch (husband of James' daughter Annie) was listed as a Co-Tenant with Sarah Anne Wolfenden until 1894 and subsequently Joseph Birch was listed as sole tenant.

Further avenues of inquiry –

- 1861 Census (James Sr. and Ann).
- 1890-1894 -- Still searching for the death of James (Jr.) and Sarah Ann.
- Verify Prestwich Baptismal entries (Parish Church of Prestwich was St. Mary's church and is depicted to right)¹⁷
- Find burial locale for James Wolfenden
